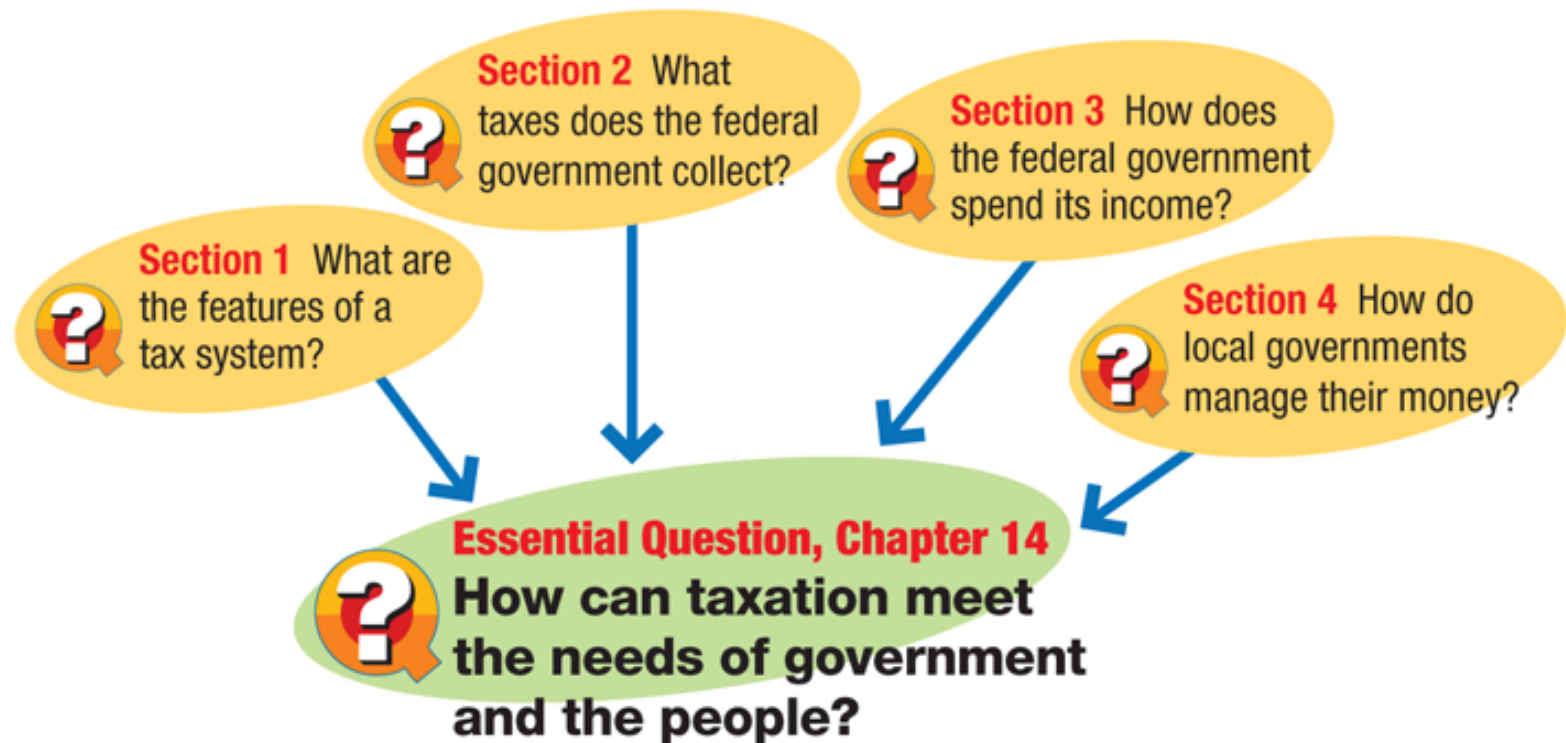

Guiding Questions

- Section 1: What Are Taxes?
 - What are the features of a tax system?
 - Fairness is one of the main features of a tax system as is simplicity, efficiency, and certainty.



Guiding Questions

- Section 2: Federal Taxes
 - What taxes does the federal government collect?
 - The government collects individual income taxes, corporate income taxes, FICA taxes, excise taxes, estate taxes, gift taxes, and tariffs.



Guiding Questions

- Section 3: Federal Spending
 - How does the federal government spend its income?
 - The federal government spends its income on mandatory programs like Social Security, Medicare, and other entitlements, and on discretionary programs like defense, education, law enforcement, and disaster relief.

- Section 4: State and Local Taxes and Spending
 - How do local governments manage their money?
 - Local governments levy taxes and create budgets in accordance with priorities set by elected local government officials.
